

Chair's Message

Dear Friends:

This report is a testament to the untiring work of FAVA/CA volunteers. Florida International Volunteer Corps consultants and volunteer board members alike, and to the generosity of our many funding partners, private donors and friends.

Fiscal Year 2001 concluded September 30, 2001, with an impressive 115 professional exchanges to 23 nations of Central America and the Caribbean. Twenty-five staff, board members and volunteers participated in 27 development/evaluation missions, including 12 in collaboration with US Southern Command, the Pan American Development Foundation and the Center for Disaster Management and Humanitarian Assistance at the University of South Florida.

Public education efforts included hosting over 200 individuals at FAVA/CA's Outstanding Volunteer Awards Breakfast February 20, 2001, where Florida Secretary of State Katherine Harris presented awards to five recipients. A special thanks to FAVA/CA volunteers was extended by Foreign Minister Maria Eugenia Brizuela de Avila of El Salvador.

Volunteer activities were featured in 37 local, national and international media coverages. The FAVA/CA newsletter *Communique* was distributed to 8,000 addressees.

Aggressive resource development strategies for FY 2001 and for FY 2002 yielded record-setting numbers. More than \$1,212,064 was secured from Florida sources (Department of State and Department of Education), federal (USAID-Haiti) and private (Pan American Development Foundation, INL International Narcotics and Law Enforcement, University of South Florida and individual contributors. For FY 2002, \$753,212 has been secured, and proposals totaling \$2,996,217 have been submitted to 21 public and private institutions.

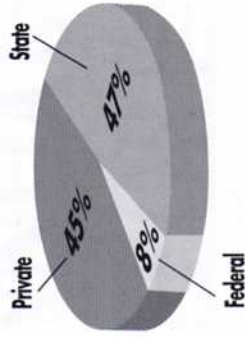

Revenues & Expenses

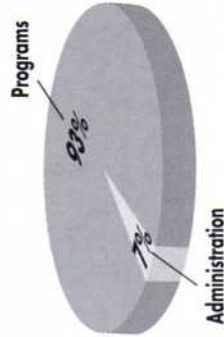
Year Ended September 30, 2001

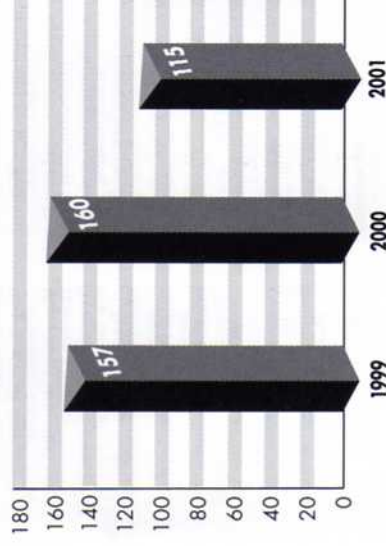

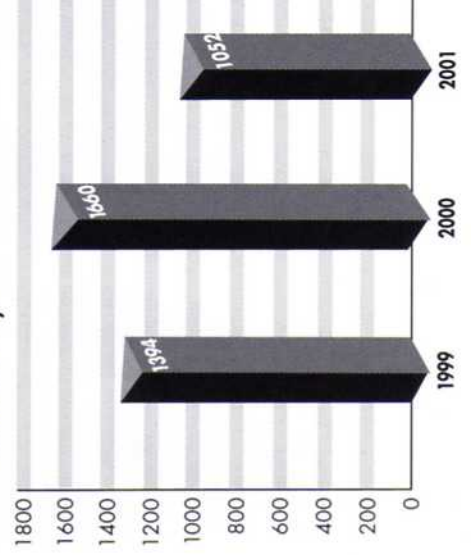

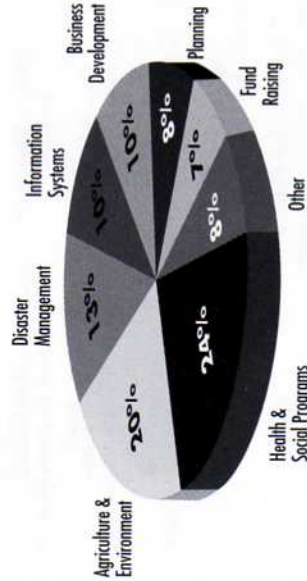
