GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS ASSESSED BY STRUCTURAL ENGINEER

Long-time FAVACA partner and Haitian Minister of Tourism, Patrick Delatour, now head of the *Haitian Commission Responsible for Shelter Building and Reconstruction Planning*, requested assistance from FAVACA. Volunteer Jack Sullivan, an Orlando-based structural engineer, traveled to Port-au-Prince February 16-23, 2010, to work hand in hand with the Government of Haiti to assess damaged buildings. The analysis and cost assessment are in support of the United Nations' March 31st donors forum in New York where the Haitian Government will request the necessary funds to rebuild the country.

REGISTERED NURSE AND TRAUMA COUNSELOR PROVIDES IMMEDIATE RELIEF

Following the devastating January 12th earthquake, veteran FAVACA volunteer Lory Servil, North Miami, provided her psychiatric nurse experience to benefit numerous domestic and international organizations providing care to the injured. Supporting the efforts of the <u>United Nations</u>, <u>Relief International</u>, Bread for the Poor, and the Children's Kingdom Orphanage, she spent two weeks providing urgent medical care for the critically wounded and assisting with infection control and the emotional comfort of patients. As a Haitian Creole speaker, Servil also helped assess damaged medical



facilities with Relief International including the General Hospital, Hospital Saint Francois de Sales, and a dozen other hospitals and medical facilities. Servil traveled to Haiti January 17-February 1, 2010. This project was made possible due to donations from our generous supporters.

FAVACA hosted a Haitian Hometown Association Workshop on Saturday February 20th from 8am-5pm. Hugo Cardona of <u>Core Strategies for Non-Profits</u> and Les Weil of <u>Les</u>

Weil Consulting LLC presented to a group of 35 Haitian-Americans on financial accountability, project management, and fundraising. FAVACA has been working alongside the Haitian diaspora

since its inception in 1982. The workshop provided the skills requested by diaspora organizations to build the capacity of their organizations as we rebuild Haiti together. The training was supported under grant from the <u>Western Union Foundation</u> and was



in collaboration with and hosted by Florida Atlantic University's School of Social Work.
